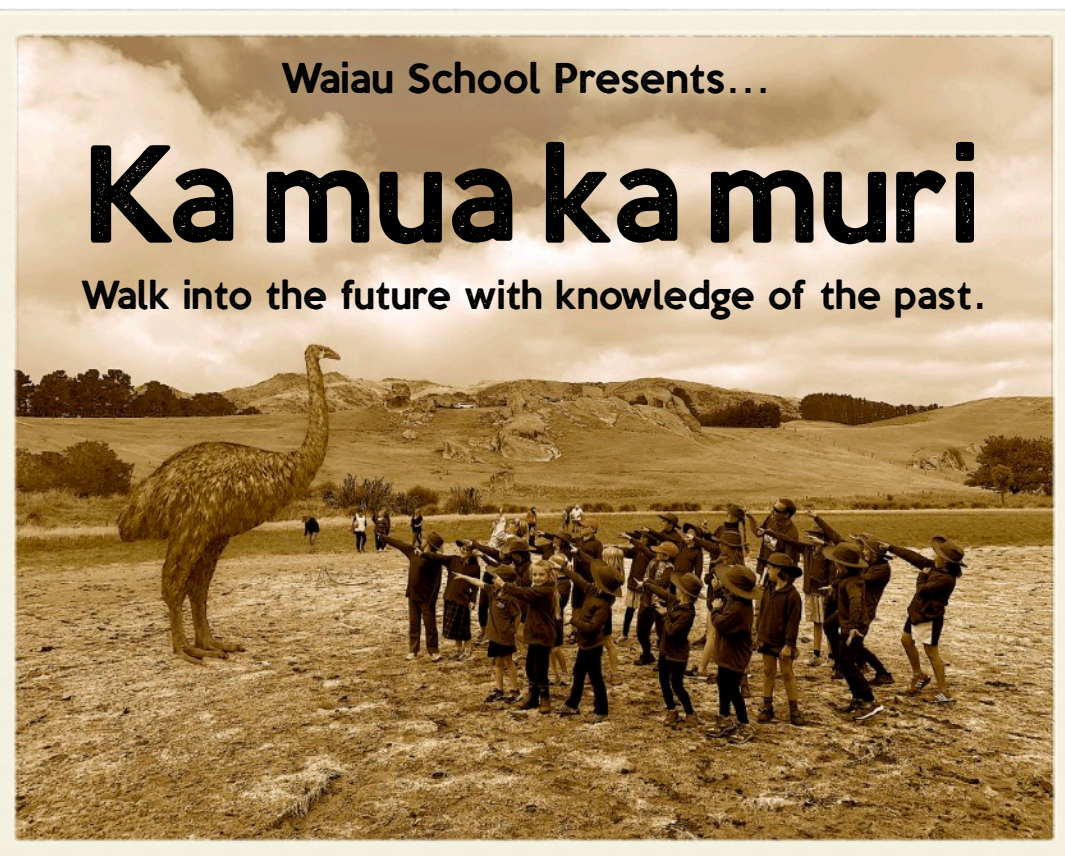
## School Production - Ka Mua Ka Muri

- Covid Guidelines - We encourage you to wear a mask, social distance from people you don't know and PLEASE sign in using the covid tracer app. DO NOT come onto school grounds if you have cold or flu symptoms.

- All animals must be under control at all times.
- Dogs must be dosed for hydatids. We have a list of those that were dosed at school.
- Please bring a drinking container for your animal.
- Don't forget to bring your lamb's/calf's bottle (250ml) with milk in it for the drinking competition. Bring it with you and place it in the staffroom. Name your bottle.
- All animals must be in a secure box/cage or on a lead and under your control until you have securely tied your pet up at the area marked.
- Bring your fancy dress clothes for your pet to enter the fancy dress parade.

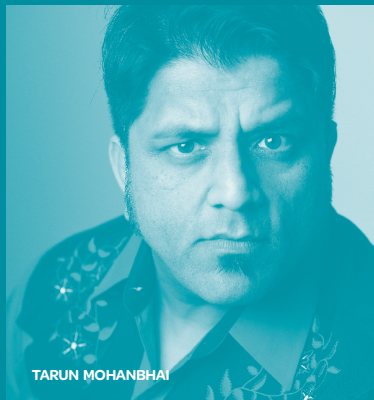
