Thank you to all those who helped out on our Marae trip. It was an amazing experience for our learners, especially as almost all our students were able to share their pepeha in front of our community. The support of our parents on trips like this is just amazing. Our school has over 40% of our learners who identify as Māori. Trips and experiences like this are an important part of ensuring we are learning about our place in the world. We have visited our local marae at Takahanga for the past two years. Although this is the marae that our school is affiliated with, we are open to visiting other local marae in the future. If you have an idea, please let us know!

This term we are exploring change and contrast in our community. We are looking at what change has occurred in our little town, what were the conditions that caused this change, and then comparing and contrasting our town to other places in the world. We have kicked off this learning with a visit to our local museum, and exploring lots of old artifacts and photos.

Cross Country is back, so please ensure your child has comfortable footwear they can run in. Our big focus this year is Constant Forward Motion! It does not matter how fast you go, but you just need to keep going! Our big day is Friday the 28th of May.

Cybersafety Reminder

Please read this email that was sent out to schools in our area. Having conversations with your child about how to keep safe online in very important. At school we have touched on it both in class, and with the Life Education Trust. Please ensure you know what your children are up to online, and if you need any support we can help out.

This is a reminder to all parents and caregivers to please keep your child safe online at all times. We have safety nets in place for our students during their school day online, through the Ministry of Education's Network for Learning. There has been a serious and upsetting incident online recently with a student in Canterbury on an application called 'Among Friends' which is marketed as an online game and social messaging application for children. This is NOT safe and your child could be exposed to a range of strangers all over the world. Unfortunately children are exposed and encouraged to get the application from another supposedly safe application called 'Among Us.' The application is reviewed on this link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rtAWAdxnQt8. Before you download an application for your child you can google App Reviews, to find out their safety rating for children.

The recommendation from Netsafe New Zealand is that social messaging sites and chat room applications and games, are definitely not safe or appropriate for children under 13 years of age. If you allow your children on devices please make sure they are in a shared area of your home where you can see them, like the lounge (not in their bedroom) and allow just the educational games and applications available. The ones we use and promote as safe are Prodigy (Mathematics), Maths Buddy, Epic Reading and Minecraft.

This is an opportunity for all of us to review the safety of the internet for our children, at home and remind us how vigilant we need to be. For advice at any point, please contact me - principal@waiau.school.nz or call Netsafe 0508 638 723.

Solar Panels



We were lucky to secure a government sustainability grant to replace the old domestic solar panel system with a state of the art new solar panel and battery system. With the right conditions this system will produce 14.52kW of power for our school! To ensure we receive the most benefit out of the panels we have upgraded the power cabling from the solar panels to both the hall and the main part of the school. This will ensure that we get the most out of the panels over their lifespan.


When the system is all signed off we will ask Sunergy to come and explain how the system works and the benefits to our community. There might even be some food from our garden!







In our writing this week we have been sharing our experiences from the marae trip. The children showed us their confidence at the marae by sharing their pepeha they created.





















