#### Ferrymead

Last week we visited Ferrymead Heritage Park to enhance and expand our learning on our inquiry topic Ka Mua, Ka Muri. We have been looking at how change over time occurs and how needs create change. The children had a lovely time dressing up and stepping back in time. It was really nice to hear the comments from the Ferrymead Staff about the manners and perfect behaviour from our gorgeous children. Thank you to all of our parents for joining us and providing transport.



#### Attendance

Our attendance data is tracking better this term than last, although 50% of our learners are not meeting the minimum requirements of 90% attendance. This is disappointing. We remind our school community that we take attendance very seriously, and if your child is not attending school we must be notified. Everyday counts, and students who miss days for non legitimate reasons impacts not only their learning but how our classes run. If you child is absent please use our app or school phone and leave a message to keep us informed.

#### **3 Way Conferences**

Room 2 - Monday, 5th July / Room 1 - Wednesday, 7th July

This is an opportunity for our students to lead a conversation about their learning this term. One of our key aims in our school charter is to increase student agency and see our students taking ownership of their learning. We see these conferences as an important part of students explaining their learning and sharing their successes. This is an opportunity for you to sit down with your child and your child's teacher and hear about their learning and their next learning steps.

#### Keeping Ourselves Safe - Constable Ken discussion

We thank Constable Ken who shared what the KOS programme is about with some of our parent community. He shared some shocking statistics around child abuse and the risks our young people face. He shared some ideas to keep our children safe online as well. Unvetted use and access to the internet is highly dangerous to our youth. He shared his 5 tips below.

Ban bedrooms: Prevent your children from going to their rooms with a device. Make them use the internet in public/shared spaces of the home i.e living or dining rooms.

Set time limits: For smaller kids, this may be for up to 30 minutes a day or only on the weekends.

Create passwords: Make sure you know the passwords for all of their devices and various social media accounts.

Regular checks: Let them know that you'll occasionally check their texts, emails, posts, photos and settings. Explain that it's not spying, you're just teaching them to be responsible.

Get it in writing: Consider drawing up a contract between yourself and your child outlining the dos and don'ts. Include consequences for rule violations.


